Plant Outdoors

Midsummer Planting will provide fall and winter crops.

Beets

P Spider mites can become a problem on
E ornamental plants, vegetables, and fruit
S plants during hot, dry weather. Watch for
T dusty-looking foliage, loss of color, and
S presence of tiny mites. Wash infested areas
with water or spray with appropriate
pesticides.

**Dig spring bulbs when tops have died down;
divide and store or replant.**

Herbal Advice

**July is the prime time to
pick and freeze or dry
herbs for later use.**

Early morning is the best time to water vegetable and flower gardens to reduce evaporation. Water the soil, rather than leaves to reduce disease. Water deeply and infrequently to encourage root growth.

Oregon on average has approximately 125 days between the last and first frost. The last frost is stated to occur on April 26th according to the USDA. Oregon is in USDA plant hardiness zones 5-9. So, if you are looking for specific planting dates, make sure to use the zones above as reference.
